

## **OBJECTIVES**

SYSTOUR's main goal is to move the tourism flow to the less exploited rural areas, emphasising the particularities of these territories, combining sustainability, economic and social development of rural tourism activities, looking for a balance in each territory's flows and connecting areas through 3 main aspects:

- mobility (transport, public or private initiatives)
- digital connection
- particular experiences (health & leisure, gastronomy, spa offers).

The project aims to provide innovative tools for tourism action helping regions explore how territorial governance approaches and economic development could deliver mutually beneficial impacts for rural territories, coastal areas, wetlands, and seas through

- the analysis of ESIF data
- formulation of holistic diagnosis
- improvement of 6 regional policy instruments.
